Essex Primary School bring the Caribbean to London

Essex Primary School celebrated the life of Sam King, MBE, in Carnival: Bringing the Caribbean to London.

On Friday, 21 October 2016, Newham Deputy Mayor, Lester Hudson, a former Essex pupil himself, was among the audience of invited guests, parents and children at the Year 6 performance.

As part of their Black History Month studies, pupils learned about the challenges Sam King faced as the first Black Mayor of Southwark and how his experiences led to the creation of the Notting Hill Carnival.



The pupils combined song, dance and drama, mixing the music from Africa, Europe and the Caribbean that characterises the Notting Hill Carnival. Supporting the performance were award-winning musicians: Cleveland Watkiss, the Evening Standard's Best Male Jazz Singer in Britain and 2010 Winner of the London Jazz Awards for Best Vocalis, and Eska Mtungwazi, 2015 Mercury Prize Nominee.



After the applause, Head Teacher, Rosie Cowan, invited Councillor Hudson to address the audience. He spoke of his fond memories of attending Essex Primary School, and hoped that his own success would inspire the children to aim high in life and make a positive change to the world around them just like Sam King.



Rosie said: "It has been wonderful to celebrate such an inspiring figure as Sam King and to involve an inspiring figure from our own community, Deputy Mayor, Lester Hudson. Essex pupils have learned from these figures as well as each other and can see that they are playing an important part in promoting the values of diversity, community and teamwork."

Apart, from Councillor Hudson and other invited guests, newly qualified teacher, Rachael Simmons, found the performance inspirational, saying:

"One of the many highlights, from my first term at Essex Primary School, has been participating in the truly inspiring Music Project for Black History Month. As a class teacher, I believed I knew a lot about the children in my class already, however the project enabled me to get to know them on a whole new level: I discovered their hidden talents, learned alongside them and together we were able to put on a performance to be proud of. The

invaluable experience was something the children and I were extremely grateful for, and we will be looking forward to many more creative, energising and fruitful experiences together at Essex Primary School in the future."

The pupils also explored the history of Carnival, an eighteenth-century

> Christian tradition that. when it reached the islands of the Caribbean, was adopted by the African slaves, who added their own rhvthms and traditions to the forms. This resulted in the dynamic mix of culture now recognised Carnival.

A giant leap for Maryland

Four pupils from Maryland took a giant leap obn behalf of their fellow pupils as they presented at the Principia Schools Conference to an audience including astronaut Tim Peake.

The pupils were selected by Principia as one of only 10 UK schools invited to present their work to other schools, scientists and space industry representatives at the Schools Conference in Portsmouth.

Maryland was the only Newham school selected to attend the conference. Representing the school and the Borough on Wednesday, 2 November 2016 were Nabil, Mathew, Ivayla and Seynab.

The Schools Conferences celebrate the work done by over a million school students throughout the UK, inspired by Tim's Principia mission. Students presented their work through talks and exhibitions to Tim and experts from the UK Space Agency and the European Space Agency (ESA).

At the conference, Tim Peake gave a half-hour talk about a day in the life of an astronaut working for 6 months on the International Space Station (ISS). After his talk, Maryland were the first school to present, which the children did proudly and with confidence.

The school used a grant from the



UK Space Agency to build a stand-

alone website devised to showcase pupil writing. Launched in January 2016, pupils wrote their own books in several chapters, on the premise of being the first child chosen to go on a space mission.

The highlight of the Conference for the pupils was the opportunity to meet Tim Peake, the first British astronaut to work on the ISS, and to ask him questions.

Tim Peake said: "Encouraging students to engage with my Principia mission was always something that I had hoped to do and I am thrilled at the range of different things young people have done to follow my mission. I'm really looking forward to hearing about all these tremendous projects direct from the students themselves."

Mrs Cooper, Deputy Headteacher of Maryland, said: "These children will never forget the day they shook hands with an astronaut. No money can buy such a memorable experience."

Inside the Houses of Parliament

Pupils from Calverton Primary School visited the Houses of Parliament with Head teacher, Caroline Crompton, to meet with MPs for lunch and a forum concerning school dinners.



The Calverton representatives were the sole children in attendance.

They were interviewed about their school dinner experience and discussed the future of free school meals.

One pupil reported:

"On Wednesday, 2 November 2016, four pupils from School Council went over to the House of Commons to talk about the change of school meals.

Kata, Darnell, Rosheen and Samuel went to the House of Commons and had a great time and learnt some new things. We took lots of pictures with the MPs and even met some famous ones as well. We met some Lords and some researchers and journalists.



We even had an exclusive tour of the Houses of Parliament. The food was amazing and was delicious (and also the dessert) we had an amazing time at the House of Commons. It was spectacular."

England China Exchange 2016/17



A fantastic opportunity to see the lessons in action

You will have no doubt seen in the news over the recent years the drive towards developing a deeper understanding in maths for our children. The methods and techniques used to teach maths in China have continued to drive standards higher, with Shanghai now sitting at the top of the International Pisa test (2014).

The **London North East Maths Hub** is working closely with the NCETM to help spread the word of mastery within maths. Depth, variation and fluency are 3 key factors to a mastery approach and are being developed and adopted by schools across the country. Many schools are already underway and are making changes to the teaching of maths in their schools and part of this involves CPD for teachers. It is vital that teachers are being given the opportunity to experience a mastery approach before embarking on change in their own classroom.

The most effective forms of CPD take place in the classroom - with real children and real teaching. As part of the Shanghai Exchange, **Tudor Court Primary** is hosting the return leg and will be offering an open door for colleagues from the London North East Hub to come along and observe lessons in Year 2 and Year 6. The day will begin with a pre-lesson discussion where you will find out about the lesson you are going to observe, this will be followed by the lesson and the post-lesson discussion where you will be able to discuss the teaching with our Shanghai colleagues.

Secondary Bar Modelling

Bar modelling (sometimes also referred to as line modelling) is a common feature of pictorial representations used by high performing Asian countries to solve mathematical problems with whole numbers, fractions, percentages, ratio, proportion and algebra. It is a successful approach that enables students to draw the structure of a word problem that involves whole/part relationships.

This course is for teachers of KS3 mathematics. It will assist them in becoming accomplished users of the bar model in order that they can develop its use with their students. We will be considering its use for fractions, percentages, ratio and algebra.

The Trainer:

Caroline Clissold is an experienced teacher, having taught all years form Years 1 to 6. For nine years, she was the mathematics consultant for a London borough responsible for implementing the National Numeracy Strategy and subsequently the renewed version into local schools. She worked with the National Centre for the Excellence of Teaching in Mathematics as a coordinator and then Maths Hub link advisor for eight years. She now works as a freelance consultant.

Caroline's main interests lie in helping schools to develop a mastery curriculum as they have in successful countries such as Singapore in order to help children develop and deepen their conceptual understanding of all of the mathematics they learn and to understand how concepts and ideas in mathematics link together and also within the wider curriculum.

Due to its popularity, we have run the Primary Bar Modelling course on three separate occasions in the last 2 years. We have received very positive feedback from these:
