



At the Education Investor Awards

On Wednesday, 16 November 2016, a cohort from NPW braved the rain and the traffic to cross London for the Education Investor Awards, held at the Lancaster London.

The annual awards recognise excellence in the UK education industry. St Bonaventure's International School Award

St Bonaventure's has been awarded the British Council's prestigious International School Award in recognition of its work to bring the world into the classroom.

The International School Award is a badge of honour for schools that do outstanding work in international education, such as through links with partner schools overseas. Fostering an international dimension in the curriculum is at the heart of the British Council's work with schools, so that young people gain the cultural understanding and skills they need to live and work as global citizens.

The assessor was impressed with the work St Bonaventure's does with exchanges with schools in France, Germany, Belgium and Spain and the way it involves students in language events such as the MFL X Factor competition, Language film days and Black

History Month.

International Links Coordinator at St Bonaventure's, Emma Hoy, was responsible for putting together the application and added: "I am in no doubt what impressed assessors was our active links with so many schools in Europe that provides unique opportunities for our students and encourages them to use a foreign language in a real context."

John Rolfe, from the British Council, said: "The school's fantastic international work has rightfully earned it this prestigious award. The International School Award is a great chance for schools to demonstrate the important work they're doing to bring the world into their classrooms. Adding an international dimension to



children's education ensures that they are truly global citizens and helps prepare them for successful future careers in an increasingly global economy."

The award is now available worldwide in countries such as India, Sri Lanka, Egypt, Lebanon, Cyprus and Pakistan as part of the British Council's Connecting Classrooms programme. Around 5,000 International School Awards have been presented to successful schools in the UK since the scheme began in 1999.

Newham RE teachers

Teachers from Newham primary schools received a master class in the Christian faith.

On Wednesday, 9 November 2016 RE Teachers and 12 church leaders from across Newham met at the new teacher training rooms at Elmhurst Primary school.

Representing the Roman Catholic, Church of England, Baptist, Methodist, Evangelical, Pentecostal, Orthodox, Charismatic, Congregational and Salvation Army churches, the church leaders spent time talking with the teachers in small groups about the distinctive beliefs of the different Christian churches as well as what they share.

Sarah Lennon, from Park Primary School, said: "I thoroughly enjoyed meeting a range of Christian Church leaders. I realised through discussions that the range of Christian denominations was



confusing to those non-Christian school RE leads. I also learnt some of the differences between the Christians churches which was great."

Meetings of this sort will take place each term and are designed to support teachers in their professional development around teaching RE in Newham, the most diverse Borough in the UK.

Claire Clinton, RE advisor to Newham schools said: "I think apart from everyone enjoying meeting the different leaders, the teachers got to see the bigger picture of the Christian religion. Christians come from all over the world, and it was great hearing about services in different languages that go on each week in Newham churches, as well as all the different nationalities that attend. One church has over 60 different nationalities in its congregation."

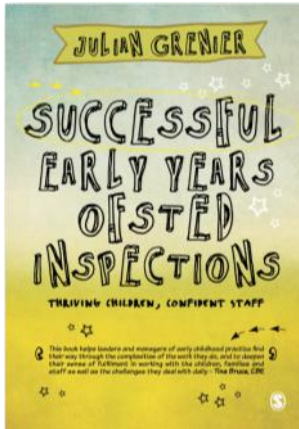

England China Exchange 2016/17

A fantastic opportunity to see the lessons in action

You will have no doubt seen in the news over the recent years the drive towards developing a deeper understanding in maths for our children. The methods and techniques used to teach maths in China have continued to drive standards higher, with Shanghai now sitting at the top of the International Pisa test (2014).

The **London North East Maths Hub** is working closely with the NCETM to help spread the word of mastery within maths. Depth, variation and fluency are 3 key factors to a mastery approach and are being developed and adopted by schools across the country. Many schools are already underway and are making changes to the teaching of maths in their schools and part of this involves CPD for teachers. It is vital that teachers are being given the opportunity to experience a mastery approach before embarking on change in their own classroom.

The most effective forms of CPD take place in the classroom - with real children and real teaching. As part of the Shanghai Exchange, **Tudor Court Primary** is hosting the return leg and will be offering an open door for colleagues from the London North East Hub to come along and observe lessons in Year 2 and Year 6. The day will begin with a pre-lesson discussion where you will find out about the lesson you are going to observe, this will be followed by the lesson and the post-lesson discussion where you will be able to discuss the teaching with our Shanghai colleagues.

Maths Together

This programme is led by Fliss James, deputy head teacher at Comet Nursery School (rated Outstanding by Ofsted).

The three sessions will focus on key issues in early years maths and national best practice:

- How children's knowledge of number develops
- How an enabling environment supports mathematical thinking and problem-solving
- How breadth and depth of receptive and expressive vocabulary supports children's mathematical thinking and understanding

The programme is practically-based, and includes action-planning for improvement, supported by a half-day visit to each participant's school. The course structure includes collecting data to show impact.

Costs: This programme costs £500 for the year, including half a day of in-school support from the trainer, Fliss James.

Secondary Bar Modelling

Bar modelling (sometimes also referred to as line modelling) is a common feature of pictorial representations used by high performing Asian countries to solve mathematical problems with whole numbers, fractions, percentages, ratio, proportion and algebra. It is a successful approach that enables students to draw the structure of a word problem that involves whole/part relationships.

This course is for teachers of KS3 mathematics. It will assist them in becoming accomplished users of the bar model in order that they can develop its use with their students. We will be considering its use for fractions, percentages, ratio and algebra.

The Trainer:

Caroline Clissold is an experienced teacher, having taught all years from Years 1 to 6. For nine years, she was the mathematics consultant for a London borough responsible for implementing the National Numeracy Strategy and subsequently the renewed version into local schools. She worked with the National Centre for the Excellence of Teaching in Mathematics as a coordinator and then Maths Hub link advisor for eight years. She now works as a freelance consultant.


Caroline's main interests lie in helping schools to develop a mastery curriculum as they have in successful countries such as Singapore in order to help children develop and deepen their conceptual understanding of all of the mathematics they learn and to understand how concepts and ideas in mathematics link together and also within the wider curriculum.

Due to its popularity, we have run the Primary Bar Modelling course on three separate occasions in the last 2 years. We have received very positive feedback from these:

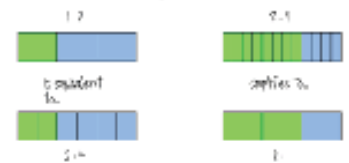
